The Seventh International Renal Meeting with Mayo Clinic in Sardinia will be held in Cagliari from May 29th to June 1st 2025.

After fourteen years the International Meeting with Mayo Clinic is now in its seventh edition.

Thanks to the experience acquired in the past six editions and the appreciation expressed by participants other than the lecturers' high quality for the debate, we are encouraged to extend the time dedicated to the discussion for each topic. During the upcoming edition of the meeting, furthermore, the structural organization of each subject recently debated at major international conferences will be prevalent, featuring 25-minutes lectures followed by 25-minutes discussions with two young chairs and an expert "strong" panel of discussants plus audience discussion.

Ten sessions, five lectures and two lunch meetings have been planned.

As far as clinical nephrology is concerned, considering the new therapeutics approach that has recently entered everyday use in clinical practice, we will focus our attention on the "New ERA of GN treatment" (Primary and Secondary GNs). The first day of the meeting is dedicated to presenting and discussing the new scheme of therapeutic approach to Membranous Nephropathy, MCD and FSGS, IgA Nephropathy, Lupus Nephritis, ANCA Related Vasculitis, MCGN, and DKD. The focus will be on all new immunosuppressive drugs used in the therapy of induction and maintenance of the above-listed Glomerulonephritis, such as new biologic drugs, anti-BAFF therapy, anti-complement therapies and also new anticalcineurin drugs and others. Concerning glomerulonephritis (and DKD), the focus will also be on the anti-progression of renal damage drugs such as SGLT2 inhibitors, anti-endothelin, and non-steroidal selective MRA. All new therapies, such as Semaglutide and GLP-1 receptor agonists, ACE inhibitors, sartans and other new prospective therapies still under research will be addressed.

One lunch meeting will be focused on "old" and new drugs for personalized therapy of Fabry Disease [enzyme replacement therapy (ERT): agalsidase alfa, agalsidase beta; chaperone therapy (migalastat); pegunigalsidase alfa; investigational therapies].

One session will update participants on kidneys and pregnancy and the treatment of hypertension during pregnancy.

Two sessions are dedicated to Onco-Nephrology and the best use of onco-drugs to avoid as many renal adverse effects as possible.

The session on renal transplantation will mainly focus on the therapy of acute rejection and antibody-mediated chronic rejection (ABMR), the influence that minor HLA antigens have on these types of rejection, and how they condition the immunosuppressive therapy scheme.

A dedicated session will address key insights about how genetics determines and influences many kidney diseases, including chronic kidney disease and major monogenic kidney diseases (Alport syndrome).

Finally, lectures on new approaches to treating hyperkalemia, anemia in uremia and teledialysis in PD patients will be held.

A lunch meeting will be dedicated to how artificial intelligence (AI) can help nephrologists predict the progression of kidney damage. Finally, during the opening ceremony, two readings specific to Sardinia will be delivered to our Italian and foreign guests: one on the genetics of the origin of the Sardinian people and the other one on the history of Sardinian Nuragic culture and how artificial intelligence can help the exploration of Nuraghi and foster UNESCO recognition of that culture.

We have chosen the same time of the year as the last edition, trusting in the good weather of early summer in Cagliari. On behalf of Fernando Fervenza, Sanjeev Sethi and Dario Roccatello, along with Honorary Presidents Richard Glasscock and Claudio Ponticelli I am pleased to invite you all to attend this event.

We look forward to seeing you in Cagliari and we believe that the quality of the scientific programme, together with Sardinian hospitality, will guarantee a successful outcome as in the previous editions.
